

2. MEMBERSHIP

4. MARRIAGE INFORMATION SERVICE

In addition, for over 15 years a List Of Eligible Boys along with their details i.e. date of birth, height, gotra, educational qualifications and addresses of parents/guardians is being published. People from all over India, as also people residing abroad, have started sending bio-data's of eligible boys to the Sabha's office to incorporate the names in the Eligible Boys list. As a result both boys and girls get wider choice to select a suitable life partner. This service is now supplemented by holding periodic Get-togethers of eligible boys and girls along with their parents/guardians which has been a big success. As people are dispersed all over Greater Mumbai and nearby cities, these meetings provide a platform for interaction for both the parties. Sabha is receiving several letters appreciating this service. The response in terms of alliances materializing as a result of these get togathers is very encouraging. Community people need to be thanked for coming forward enthusiastically to sponsor this activity. G. S. B. Sabha's Mahila Shakha is helping the community to solve one of its big problems by self help. During the year, 4 get to-gathers of eligible boys and girls along with their parents were held, details about which are given in the Mahila Shakha report printed elsewhere in this report.

5. VIDYANIDHI FUND

G.S.B.Community gives priority to education. Therefore, G.S.B.Sabha's

Vidyanidhi Fund is used to disburse financial assistance to the economically backward students of the community. As more and more needy people are going in for education, and as the cost of living and the educational expenses are escalating, Sabha appeals to all members to donate generously to this Vidyanidhi Fund.

During the year, Sabha gave cash assistance of Rs.91,000 to 206 School students and Rs. 35,400 to 59 college students. In addition Sabha selected 8 needy students pursuing professional education who were given Rs. 6,550.

The Sabha is helped in this cause for past several years by Shri Walkeshwar Kashi Math by donating Rs. 6,000/- annually. Also Rs. 2,501/- was donated by G. S. B. Sarvajanik Ganeshotsav Samiti, Wadala. In addition our members and well-wishers whole heartedly donate towards this Scheme. In this year, a sum of Rs. 1,03,385/- was so collected.

7. BHAJANS & RELIGIOUS PROGRAMMES:

- a) The Upakarma Homa (changing of the sacred thread) on 'Suta Punav' day was held on 14th August 2000 at the Sabha's office between 7 a.m. and 12 noon for which members were sent advance intimation.
- b) Bhajans are held every Friday evening at the Sabha's Office between 7.00 and 9.00 p.m. Apart from this, Bhajans are held on auspicious days like Kartik Ekadashi, Dassera and the first day of Swamiji's Chaturmas.
- c) The Annual Saptha Bhajan at Shree Walkeshwar Kashi Math, Walkeshwar; Shri Rama Naama Bhajans at Shree Rama Mandir, Wadala Bhajans during Ganeshotsav at Wadala and Ekha Bhajans at Shree Balaji Mandir, Kurla are the other religious activities in which the Sabha participates every year.
- d) The Annual Pooja at Sree Walkeshwar Kashi Math was held on 1st Sunday of the Year.

8. MAHILA SHAKHA

The Mahila Shakha conducts several programmes. A detailed report of its activities is printed elsewhere in this Report. The 25th December Anand Bazaar and 26th January Get-together were the major programmes conducted by the Mahila Shakha during the year under review. A sum of Rs. 32,720/- was collected by the Mahila Shakha as General Donations.

G.S.B.Sabha's Mahila Shakha gives Marriage Assistance to the needy. Last year, 4 applicants were given Rs. 4,000/- each. This year the assistance amount has been raised to Rs. 5,000/- per eligible applicant. Mahila Shakha appeals to all members of the Community to strengthen the Marriage Assistance Fund so that higher amount of assistance can be given.

9. SPORTS PROGRAMMES

Since 1995, the G.S.B.S. Sports Committee has been putting efforts to increase sports activities. The efforts are finding good response from sponsors as also participants.

The emphasis on Sports Activities continued with the regular sponsorship from Blow Plast Ltd. Cricket Coaching Camps are being conducted during seasons. Sabha is indebted to the unfailing support of Blow Plast Ltd. to this activity.

Also, the 8th District Level Open Carrom Tournament sponsored by Tata Power Co.Ltd. was held during the year. The ground and the pavilion are being used by schools/institutions for their various sports events. A detailed report of the Sports Pavilion Sub-Committee is given elsewhere in the Report.

11. INVESTMENT IN UNITS OF UTI 1964 SCHEME

The Sabha had made an investment of Rs.3,77,980/- in 21600 Units of UTI 1964 Scheme at an average cost of approx. Rs.17.50/- per unit in 1994-1995. Consequent to the issue of 2160 bonus units in 1996-1997, the units held by Sabha increased to 23760 units and average cost declined to approx. Rs.15.91 per unit. The returns on this investment over the years has been as under:

In July 2001, Unit Trust of India decided to implement limited repurchase of units at fixed price and subsequently migrate to a declared NAV (Net Asset Value) based repurchase of balance units. These decisions, coupled with the prevalent depressed stock market, has seen the market value of the units decline to about Rs.8/- per unit. At this price, this translates to a notional loss of about Rs.1.80 lacs for the Sabha. As stock markets are cyclical in nature, the market may improve in future and as a consequence, notional loss may decline. However, going by the accounting convention of conservatism, it has been decided to provide for the notional loss over a period of 3 years. Accordingly a provision of Rs.60,000/- for diminution in value of the investment has been made in the current year. A reference to this has been made in Note 2 of the Notes to Accounts in Schedule 'G' and by the Hon. Auditor Shri B.R. Prabhu in his report.

REPORT - G.S.B.S MEDICAL TRUST

The G.S.B.Sabha's Medical Trust has introduced new facilities—Pulmonary Function Test, Allergy tests, Andrology, Neurology, Psychologists and 2D Echo examination. The out-sourced new services included were Mammography OPG for dental department and on Sunday morning Ultra Sonography service was included in addition to the full daily services. The response has been good for these new services.

GI Endoscopy, Stress Testing facility has also been considered. The second thrust would be for various composite medical check ups for Paediatric, Executive, Ladies etc.

The Centre continues to render services at modest charges to the fixed income groups and free service to the poor. A poor Patients Fund is used to help the poor with medicines. All this has earned appreciation of the public to the G.S.B.S. Medical Centre.

New Premises: A search for new premises was successful and a 1500 Sq.Ft. first floor apartment at Rajgir Court (opposite Pritam Midtown Hotel) in Dadar, was acquired. Renovation and remodelling the apartment is in progress.

Equipment: A light cure equipment for Dental department was purchased and preliminary work on Computerisation was taken up. Additional protective devices were introduced for X-Ray technicians. A new and state—of-art ECG machine from M/S Schillar was purchased. The output is printed in an A-4 sheet instead of on strips of paper.

Donations to the Medical Trust are exempt from Income-Tax under Section 80-G of the Income Tax Act 1961.

SCHEDULE 'G' NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- i. Method of Accounting is accrual.
- Fixed Assets are stated at cost less depreciation except Sports Pavilion Building stated at cost on which no depreciation is provided being adequately covered by the balance in the Building Pavilion Fund (Corpus).
- iii. Investments (all long term) are stated at cost less provision made for permanent diminution in it's value.
- iv. All income and expenses for the year under different activities of the Sabha are included in the income and Expenditure Account. The net surplus/deficitunder each activity is then transferred to the specific activity fund from the income & Expenditure Account.

2. EVENTS AFTER THE BALANCE SHEET DATE

Since the close of the accounting year (to be specific after 1st July 2001), there has been a deep decline in the realisable value of the units of U.T.i. 1964 Scheme which is expected to be a permanent one based on the present market report. The total diminution in the value of these units held by the Sabha, based on the present market report, is expected to be in the region of Rs.1.80 lacs to Rs.1.90 lacs as compared with the carrying cost of the same. The Trustees have proposed to provide for this anticipated loss over a period of three years. Accordingly, a provision of Rs.60,000/- has been made in these accounts towards diminution in the value of investments.

The renovated I.M.Pai Hall and also part of the open play ground will be available from December 2001 onwards for marriages and social and religious functions as per municipal regulations. The beautiful ambience adds to the joy of the function.


