2. MEMBERSHIP

RENOVATION OF SUJIR GOPAL NAYAK MEMORIAL KREEDA MANDIR

The renovation of Sujir Gopal Nayak Memorial Kreeda Mandir was taken up this year at a cost of approx. 10.80 lacs. The Sabha had planned for this renovation and a separate fund had been built up from the surplus of earlier years. After invitation of tenders, Shri Y. S. Kini was appointed as the Architect for the renovation. In consultation with the architect and again after invitation of tenders, M/s A. A. Nayak & Co. were appointed as the Contractors.

The renovated pavilion was inaugurated on 18th November 2001 by Shri D. M. Sukhtankar, IAS (Retd.), former Chief Secretary to the Govt. of Maharashtra and former Municipal Commissioner. Shri Madhav Mantri, former Test player, presided over the function. The Hon. Auditor of the Sabha since more than 5 decades, Shri B. R. Prabhu and the architect were honoured on this occasion. A Ganahoma pooja was held in the morning. The full day programme was supported by a donation by Shri Ramanath Pai.

The Sabha will remain indebted to the architect, Shri Y. S. Kini, for the personal interest taken by him in this renovation and for charging a nominal amount for the services rendered by him.

5. COMPUTER CLASSES FOR SENIOR CITIZENS, HOUSEWIVES ETC.

In today's world, it is not just how literate you are but how e-literate you are. So, if you think that mouse is only cat's food and booting is putting on your shoes, it is time to be computer savvy. And what better place to do the same than at the G.S.B. Sabha. The Sabha received a suggestion from Shri Manohar H. Kamath and Smt. Kamal M. Kamath to start Computer classes for senior citizens. They backed this suggestion with the donation of a computer.

Computer Classes were inaugurated at the Sujir Gopal Nayak Memorial Kreeda Mandiron Sunday, 5th May 2001 at a function graced by the donor couple. We appeal to all members of the Community to strengthen the Marriage Assistance Fund so that higher amount of assistance can be given.

The other programmes conducted by the Mahila Shakha include the 25th December Anand Bazaar, 26th January Republic Day Get-together, Shravan, Navratri and Sankranti Haldi-Kumkums, Bhajan Competition, Sports Day etc. Total amount collected by the Mahila Shakha during the year was Rs. 48,700/-.

11. SPORTS ACTIVITIES

Several sports activities are held at the G.S.B. Sabha's Sports Club.

Cricket Coaching Camps are held during the vacations. This activity of the Sabha is supported by Blow Plast Ltd. and we will always remain grateful to Mr. Dilip Piramal, Chairman of Blow Plast Ltd, for this support. We have also been holding District level Carrom tournaments in Jan-Feb every year. This year, the 9th District Level Carrom Tournament was sponsored by Union Bank Of India and we thank their CMD, Shri V. Leeladhar, for the same.

The ground and the Pavilion are being used by schools/institutions for their various sports events. A detailed report of the Sports Pavilion Sub-Committee is given elsewhere in the Report.

12. ACCOUNTS

The Sabha made a surplus of Rs.27,801/- during the year. During the year, renovation of the Pavilion Building has been carried out at a total cost of Rs.11,93,830.

Despite the above expenditures the Sabha's accounts have ended in a surplus, thanks to the support from sponsors, donors, advertisers and well-wishers.

The surplus of Rs.27,801/- has been added to the brought forward surplus of Rs.2,41,337.96 and cumulative surplus of Rs.2,69,138.96 is carried forward.

In addition, various specific activity funds of the Sabha made a net surplus of Rs.1,23,527.15 which has been transferred to the respective funds. Investments of the Sabha as on 31st March 2002 were Rs.24,78,537.50 (net of provisions made for the diminution in value of investments in the UTI, 1964 scheme).

REPORT - G.S.B.S MEDICAL TRUST

The Board of Trustees of the GSBS Medical Trust met 9 times during the year. The Board was reconstituted at the 152nd Meeting on 9.9.2001 with the acceptance of resignations of Mr. V. V. Pai and Dr. S. R. Baliga, Dr. (Mrs.) Maya Kalelkar was inducted into the Board in the 9.9.2001 meeting in place of Dr. S. R. Baliga. Shri D.M. Suktankar joined the Board on 2.12.2001 in place of Mr. V.V. Pai. The Trust opened a second centre at Dadar for Superspeciality diagnostics on 6.1.2002 at the hands of Mr. Suresh Prabhu. Hon'ble Union Minister for Power. The function at the Pritam Dhaba was attended by a cross section of top doctors and the city's glitteratti.

Superspeciality Centre: The opening of the Superspeciality Centre was a milestone in the long history of the Trust with the Trust stepping into big league of medical healthcare. The diagnostic procedures performed here include Gastroscopy, Ultrasonography, 2-D Echocardiogram, Stress test, Mammography, Orthopantomography, X-ray etc. There is whole section of speciality dentistry covering Endodontics, Periodontics, Pedodontics, Orthodontics, Prosthodontics, Maxillo facial surgery and Aesthetic dentistry. The focus at this Unit is clearly on preventive health and there are a number of health check-up packages aimed at attracting the corporate employees of different levels. The Centre has consultation faculty in Urosurgery, G-1. Surgery, Cardiovascular and Thoracic surgery, Cardio surgery, Plastic surgery, Paediatric surgery, Endocrinology and Neurology. The Trust decided to go in for the latest technology in Ultrasonography by updating old Ultrasonography Unit to Logiq500 with a host of features which has enabled the centre to be on par with any hospital or diagnostic centre in this discipline. This marks a real quantum leap in healthcare service.

Office automation: A series of meetings on planning a smooth change over to computerized front office and accounting were held during the year. The broad framework of essential information was finalised to work out the customised software. The system of Unique ID for patients would be introduced from the day one of computerized billing. This will enable us to trace patient through the years whenever he visits the Centre.

Marketing: The installation of a number of state-of-the-art equipment for a variety of investigations has necessitated working on an aggressive marketing strategy to offset the initial capital costs. Advertising in trade journals and an intensive direct mail campaign were launched to bring

awareness of the Superspeciality Centre. It is our belief that these attempts have helped in passing a good word around and further broadening the patient base of the Centre. The 2 Medical Centres received over 50,000 new patients during the year, which is a fair increase over the previous year.

Outsourced services: The Trust has entered into special arrangements with Chitra Scan & Imaging Centre. Behind Chitra Cinema, Dadar for CT Scanning of patients. In the same way, there is an arrangement with MRI Centre at Bhatia General Hospital for magnetic resonance imaging on patients. Both these arrangements are finalised at almost half the rates otherwise offered by them to their direct patients. The patients are sent by prior appointment and these arrangements are working satisfactiorily to the advantage of our patients.

The Trust arranged for a Mammography camp in Feb 2002 where in some 23 women were investigated by Mammography for breast lumps etc. The event became a shot in the arm for the Superspeciality Unit.

NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- Method Of Accounting is accrual.
- Fixed Assets are stated at cost less depreciation except Sports Pavilion Building stated at cost on which no depreciation is provided being adequately covered by the balance in the Building Pavilion Fund (Corpus).
- iii. Investments (all long term) are stated at cost less provision made for permanent diminution in it's value.
- iv. All Income and Expenses for the year under different activities of the Sabha are included in the Income and Expenditure Account. The net surplus/deficit under each activity is then transferred to the specific activity fund from the Income & Expenditure Account
- The Sabha had made an investment of Rs. 3,77,980/- in 21600 units of UTI, 1964 scheme. Subsequently the Sabha received 2160 bonus units from UTI.

As per the present announcement by UTI, the Sabha will realise an amount of Rs. 2,47,600/- in May 2003 for the 23760 units held by it.

First 5,000 units @ Rs.12 per unit Rs. 60,000

Balance 18760 units @ Rs.10 per Unit Rs. 1,87,600

Total Rs. 2,47,600

Thus, total diminution in the value of investments is Rs.1,30,380. Out of this, the Sabha has provided Rs.60,000 in the year 2000-2001 and the balance amount of Rs.70,380 has been provided in the current year as a full provision for the said diminution.


