The 68th Annual Report, together with the Audited Statement of Accounts for the financial year 2002-2003, is presented hereunder.

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2. MEMBERSHIP

During the year, 2 Patrons and 14 Life Members were admitted as members of the Sabha. Total number of Members enrolled up to 31.3.2003 is 2272. Details of new Members admitted from 1st April 2002 to 31st March 2003 are given elsewhere in this Report.

3. SHIFTING OF OFFICE PREMISES

Members will recall that G.S.B. Sabha had its registered office at Heera House, Bhaudaji Road for several decades. As intimated to the members at that time, in June 2002, the landlord of Heera House decided to pull down the building and construct a new building in its place. It is expected that the new building will be ready by mid 2004 and we will be provided office premises in the same. In the meanwhile, we were provided temporary alternative office accommodation in Neer Darshan Building, Shankara Matham Road.

In April 2003, the landlord of the Neer Darshan Building also decided to pull down the building. Our Heera House landlord has now made alternative office accommodation available to us at 17, Lila Niwas, 264/ A L.N.Road, Near Matunga Rly Stn (CR), Mumbai - 400019. The telephone number has also changed from 2402 5911 to 2416 0394. The office timings continue to be Monday to Saturday, 5 to 7 p.m.

4. FORMATION OF ADHYATMIK GROUP

During the year, an Adhyatmik Group has been formed under the convenorship of Shri N.G.Pai. This Group meets on the first Saturday of every month at 6.00 p.m. at Kreeda Mandir to have Satsang on Shrimad Bhagvad Gita, Shrimad Bhagvatam etc. Interested members may join the group. The Managing Committee is grateful to Shri N.G.Pai for devoting his time and conducting these Satsang get-togethers every month.

5. PROGRAMMES

In line with our objective to hold programmes addressing a crosssection of the Community, several programmes were held in the year addressed to children, youth, women, senior citizens, spiritually-inclined and sports-persons. It was possible for the Sabha to hold all these programmes because of the sponsorship support received for each of them and the Sabha remains indebted to its sponsors for this support. All the programmes conducted by the Sabha from April 2002 to March 2003 are detailed hereunder. A. GUDI PADVA SNEHA MILAN (2002)

Gudi Padva Sneha Milan was organised on Sunday, the 28th of April 2002. Sri A.K.S.Rao, Executive Director of Bank of Maharashtra, was the Chief Guest. F. SENIOR CITIZENS PICNIC

As in the past several years, a picnic for the Senior Citizens was organised this year also. This picnic was organised on Sunday, the 9th February 2003 at Century Rayon Complex at Shahad. A special bus was arranged to transport the Members from Dadar to Shahad and back. A visit to the famous Birla temple was also included in the programme. The programme was sponsored by Mr. G. S. Bhat.

Many games and competitions were held and were enthusiastically participated by the senior citizens. Gift items, which were given away as prizes, were sponsored by Shri B. P. Nayak. Skits were presented by Smt. Prema Kuloor and Group and by Smt. Meera Jois and Smt. Vilasini Bhandarkar.

6. MARRIAGE INFORMATION SERVICE

One of the most popular activity/programme of the Sabha is the Marriage Information Service being conducted by the Mahila Shakha Committee since more than 15 years. Informal meetings are held on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of every month between 4 and 6 p.m. at the Sabha's office. Representatives from the Mahila Shakha Committee are available on these days to provide information. The services of astrologers for the matching of horoscopes is also available. A Master List Of Eligible Boys is released in July every year and this is followed by a Supplementary List released in January every year. The List is well organised, with details of boys residing abroad being printed first followed by Professional boys and then others. Within each category, the printing is surname wise and within a surname age wise in descending order. Since last few years, periodic get-togethers of eligible boys/girls with their parents are being organised. This provides a forum for the youngsters to introduce themselves and interact with each other. Reports of certain alliances materialising out of these get-togethers have been received. These get-togethers are sponsored by well-wishers from our Community and the Sabha will always remain indebted to them for this support. During the year, 3 such get-togethers were held, details about which are given in the Mahila Shakha report printed elsewhere in this report.

7. VIDYANIDHI FUND

The Vidyanidhi Fund is used by the Sabha to give educational assistance to needy students of our Community. Details Of Assistance given during the year were as under:

In order to build the fund which can be used to disburse the assistance, an appeal is sent to the members during Gudi Padva every year to contribute to the Vidyanidhi Fund. During the last year, donations worth Rs. 96,039/- were received from members and well-wishers. In addition, the Sabha is helped in this cause for past several years by Shri Walkeshwar Kashi Math, who donated Rs. 6,500/-, and by G. S. B. Sarvajanik Ganeshotsav Samiti, Wadala, who donated Rs. 5,001/- last year.

Because of falling interest rates, it would be possible for the Sabha to continue this worthy activity on a larger scale only with increased donations from members. An appeal is made to members to donate whole-heartedly to this cause. This is your chance to light a lamp of knowledge in a needy family.

8. BHAJANS & RELIGIOUS PROGRAMMES:

- a) The Upakarma Homa (changing of the sacred thread) on 'Suta Punav' day was held on 21st August 2002 at the Sabha's office between 7 a.m. and 12 noon for which members were sent advance intimation.
- b) Bhajans are held every Friday evening at the Sabha's Office between 7.00 and 9.00 p.m. Apart from this, Bhajans are held on auspicious days like Kartik Ekadashi, Dassera and the first day of Swamiji's Chaturmas.
- The Annual Saptha Bhajan at Shree Walkeshwar Kashi Math, Walkeshwar; Shri Rama Naama Bhajans at Shree Rama Mandir,

- Wadala, Bhajans during Ganeshotsav at Wadala and Ekha Bhajans at Shree Balaji Mandir, Kurla are the other religious activities in which the Sabha participates every year.
- d) The Annual Pooja at Sree Walkeshwar Kashi Math was held on 1st Sunday of the Year.

9. MAHILA SHAKHA COMMITTEE

The Sabha's Mahila Shakha Committee comprises of a band of active and dedicated group of women contributing actively to the meeting of the Sabha's objectives over the years.

As mentioned earlier, the Marriage Information Service is being conducted and improvised upon by the Mahila Shakha Committee over the years. The Mahila Shakha Committee also manages a Marriage Assistance Fund from which marriage assistance is given to needy members of our community. Last year, Rs. 40,000/- was disbursed to 8 applicants @ Rs. 5000/- each. The Mahila Shakha Committee would like to increase the amount to be given to applicants. This will be possible only if all members strengthen the Marriage Assistance Fund with their donations. A full report of the Mahila Shakha Committee is printed elsewhere. Total amount collected by the Mahila Shakha during the year was Rs. 70,000/-.

10. SPORTS ACTIVITIES

Sports activities continue to be held at the Sabha's Sports Club. A detailed report of the Sports Pavilion Sub-Committee is given elsewhere in the Report.

11. BMC/COURT MATTERS

The Sabha gives out the I.M.Pai Hall of its Sports Club (Kreeda Mandir) for social and religious functions. This is done as per BMC rules and regulations and additional ground rent is paid by the Sabha to the BMC in this connection. This additional ground rent had been fixed by BMC at Rs. 4,000/- p.a. since several years. In the previous year, BMC has changed this policy and the additional ground rent has now to be paid at Rs. 40,000/- p.a. or 33 % of the amount collected by the Sabha during the year by giving out the hall for functions, whichever is higher.

Besides, 33% of amounts collected from caterers/decorators for granting monopoly of catering/decoration, if any, has also to be paid to BMC. The policy has been changed with retrospective effect from 1.4.2000. The total additional ground rent payable to BMC for the 3 years ending 31.03.2003 is as under:

The above liability has been fully provided in the accounts. The Managing Committee is deeply grateful to our Hon. Auditor Shri B. R. Prabhu, C.A., who has conducted the audit of these statements.

Since November 2001, the Sabha had also started letting out the playground adjoining the Sports Club for marriages and other functions as per BMC policy in this regard. As part of the terms and conditions, 30 % of the amounts collected on this account are payable to BMC. The Sabha was strictly complying with terms and conditions laid down by BMC to ensure residents of neighbouring buildings were not inconvenienced by the functions held on the ground. Also, the total functions held were well below the BMC limit to ensure that sports activities were not unduly affected. Subsequently, a writ petition was filed in the Mumbai High Court by Mr. Kisan Mehta of the Save Mumbai Committee and a few residents of the neighbouring buildings challenging the BMC policy of allowing playgrounds to be used for social and religious functions. Our neighbouring Cosmopolitan Sports Club and the GSBS Sports Club were also named as respondents in this petition. During the course of the court proceedings, the Municipal Commissioner assured the Court that the permission granted would be withdrawn. The Court allowed the Sabha to hold functions where bookings had already been accepted. In light of the above, the Sabha has now stopped letting out the ground for any functions.

An analysis of the above, with an eye to the future, shows the following:

 Interest Income on Investments has fallen in the current year as compared to the previous year. The main reasons for this have been:

- a) no dividend declared by UTI on its US 1964 Scheme vis-à-vis a dividend of Re. 1/- per unit declared last year which gave us an income of Rs. 23,760/- last year.
- b) The falling interest rates on investments of the Sabha. This would impact the Sabha more severely in the future.
- 2. Donations received by the Sabha includes amounts received from giving out of hall and ground for social and religious functions. The Sabha was able to collect an amount of Rs. 1,63,300/- in the last year by giving out its ground for various functions. In light of BMC withdrawing its permission in this regard (refer point 11 above), the income on this account is expected to fall in the future as it will comprise of the collections by giving out the hall only.
- 3. The property expenses of this year also includes Rs. 1,13,711/being additional ground rent payable for the years 2000-2001 and 2001-2002 as explained in point 11 above. This item will impact the accounts only for the year under review. However, the change in BMC policy requiring the Sabha to pay Rs. 40,000/- or 33 % of amounts collected from giving out the hall for functions as additional ground rent will impact the Sabha's revenues.

The Managing Committee takes this opportunity to thank all sponsors, advertisers, donors and well-wishers because of which the accounts have closed with a decent surplus.

The Managing Committee offers its condolences to the respective families and also to the families of Sabha's members who passed away during the year under review. May their souls rest in peace.

REPORT - G.S.B.S. MEDICAL TRUST

The Board of Trustees of the GSBS Medical Trust, Dadar met for a total of 9 times during the year under review. The Board had to be reconstituted during the year due to resignation of Mr. S.V. Pikale on health ground. Mr. Srikant B. Prabhu, Chartered Accountant was inducted as Treasurer in 158th meeting on 23rd June 2002. The term of Mr. D.M. Suktankar ended on 30.06.2002 and on his expressing his inability to continue as a Trustee, the Board at its 160th meeting requested Dr. Gopinath Shenoy, our Panel Gynaecologist and a well-known medicolegal expert to join the Board.

FINANCE:

The year commenced with the Trust standing completely clear of all overdraft facilities with several Banks which had been arranged during the previous year for acquisition of additional area for opening a Superspeciality Centre. On the advice of the Statutory Auditors, the Board decided to prematurely encash Fixed Deposits amounting to Rs.98 lakhs against which the overdraft facilities stood, and came out of the facility. Donations during the year were at a low ebb standing at Rs. 2,60,252/- and the Reserves were at an impressive Rs. 68,65,846/- at the end of the fiscal year 2002-2003. The year otherwise proved a beneficial one with gross collections touching the one crore mark.

SUPERSPECIALITY CENTRE:

Though, there was a drop in number of patients served, the earnings increased mainly due to addition of expensive procedures to the menu at the Superspeciality Unit. The range of procedures and consulting faculty widened impressively. With the joining of 14 new Consultants to the Panel, the Trust considerably extended its speciality base. The Centre got into new branches of superspecialities with the joining of an Onco Surgeon, a Paediatric Nephrologist, a Paediatric Uro Surgeon and a Paediatric Surgeon. The first full year of operations at the Superspeciality Centre ended on a moderate note with collections standing at about Rs.33 lakhs. The Centre handled in all 133 Gastroscopies, 264 Mammographies, 319 Stress Tests and 412 2-D Echocardiograms with colour doppler procedures during the year. As of 31st March, 2003 there were 62 specialist doctors on the Panel at the Medical Centre and 37 Superspecialists at the Superspeciality Centre.

UPGRADATION OF MEDICAL CENTRE:

During the year, the Board took a decision to completely moderise the X-ray equipment by addition of an Image Intensifier T.V. (IITV) which to a great extent put the Centre on level with some select hospitals in this area. It also helped the Centre to introduce many new procedures such as Miturating Cysto Urethrogram, Fistulogram, Uretogram, Sinusogram etc.

COMPUTERISATION:

With the computerization complete in all respects at the Medical Centre by July 2002, it was decided to introduce automation at the Superspeciality Centre from August 2002. With the progress of the year, this work was also achieved with ease and currently the office automation is total. Computerisation has enabled the Trust to introduce monthly settlement of payments to consultants with tax deduction at source as desired by law. It also made it possible to have a system of unique ID for patients thus making it possible to trace a patient through the years.

FLOOR SPACE ACQUISITION:

During the year 2002-2003, the Trust acquired additional floor space of 595 sq.ft in the 'B' Wing of "Rajgir Court" which falls adjacent to Superspeciality Centre, thus making it convenient to integrate with the existing activities. The Trust has decided to start some new procedures such as Electroencephalograph, Pulmonary Function Test, Bone Densitometry, Audiometry etc apart from relocating some testing units like Endoscopy equipment, Stress Test Unit, Orthopantomography machine etc. There are plans also for finishing the new Endoscopy Room into a Semi O.T. so that some minor procedures such as Endometrial Biopsy, Cervical Cauterisation, IUCD Insertion & Removal, Granuloma Cauterisation etc can be commenced, possibly by the end of Calendar Year 2003.

ORTHOPAEDIC CAMP:

The Superspeciality Centre hosted an Orthopaedic Camp on 30th March 2003. This was co-sponsored by LGCI, a wing of the South Korean LG Group. For a start, the free examination camp was a big success as about 48 people were examined in a matter of 4 hours.

SOCIAL EVENT:

The Trust held a "Get Together" over lunch for the Panel Consultants on 9th February, 2003. A total 63 Consultants attended and had an opportunity to meet and mix with their professional colleagues for developing better rapport. The President addressed the Consultants and appraised them about the aims, objectives and plans of the Trust. This the Trustees felt that would help in augmenting cross-referrals within the Centre.

HELATHY BABY CONTEST:

As in the last few years, the Trust conducted a "Healthy Baby Contest" on the 15th August 2002 at the Dwarkanath Bhavan, Ram Mandir, Wadala on the occasion of Sarvajanik Ganeshotsav. There were in all 70 entries in both the age groups and the function was a glorious success.

On the whole the year ended on a positive note.

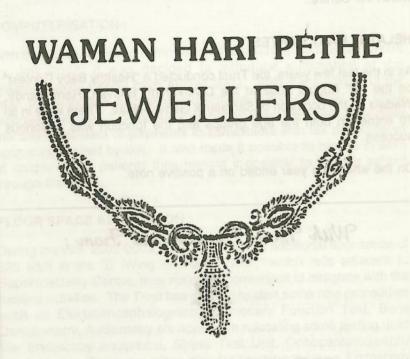
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AUDITOR'S REPORT

NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- Method Of Accounting is accrual.
- ii. Fixed Assets are stated at cost less depreciation except Sports Pavilion Building stated at cost on which no depreciation is provided being adequately covered by the balance in the Building Pavilion Fund (Corpus).
- iii. Long Term Investments are stated at cost less provision made for permanent diminution in it's value. Short Term Investments are stated at cost.
- iv. All Income and Expenses for the year under different activities of the Sabha are included in the Income and Expenditure Account. The net surplus/deficit under each activity is then transferred to the specific activity fund from the Income & Expenditure Account
- Over the last two years, the Sabha had made a total provision of Rs. 1,30,380/- for dimunition in the value of its investmentsin units of UTI US 1964 Scheme based on the information at that time. In May/June 2003, these units have been realised resulting in actual loss amounting to Rs. 1,20,380/-. The excess provision of Rs. 10,000/- made in earlier years has been reversed in this year.
- 3 Ground Rent debited in the Income & Expenditure Account includes provision for extra ground rent of Rs. 2,99,260/- (of which Rs. 1,13,711/- relates to the years 2000-01 and 2001-02) demanded by Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation authorities.

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
