The human mind can be led by either desires, which in turn takes the person on the acquisition or enjoyment path, OR by his/her intellect, which leads to correct discrimination of what is good and bad, right and wrong. The strengthening of the human intellect is an effective means of ushering peace and happiness in a person's life. The program ended with Bhojana Prasada.

4. MAHILA SHAKHA COMMITTEE

4 (A) The Mahila Shakha Committee is the vibrant and dedicated group of women working towards furthering the objectives of the Sabha. A detailed Report of the Mahila Shakha is printed elsewhere in this report. Last year, the Mahila Shakha Committee collected an amount of Rs. 39,200/- by way of donations and advertisements.

The Mahila Shakha Committee manages a Marriage Assistance Fund from which financial assistance is disbursed to support the marriage of daughters of our community. During the year, two families availed the benefit of this assistance in 2012-2013 and total assistance of Rs. 20,000/- was disbursed to them.

4 (B) MARRIAGE INFORMATION SERVICE:

This is the most popular activities of the Mahila Shakha Committee. Over the years the popularity of this activity has grown tremendously.

On the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of every month informal meetings are held by the Mahila Shakha at the Sabha's Office between 4.00 p.m. and 6.00 p.m. where the parents of eligible boys/girls come and exchange horoscopes.

The Mahila Shakha Committee also compiles list of eligible boys which is released twice a year. The Master list is released in July and the supplementary list is released in January.

Periodic Get-together of eligible boys and girls is held where the youngsters are given an opportunity to interact with each other. During the year, the 58th and 59th get-togethers were held.

A detailed report of the Mahila Shakha Committee is given elsewhere in this report.

5. VIDYANIDHI FUND

The Sabha has been giving Educational Assistance to the needy students of our Community under the Vidyanidhi Fund. During the year under review, total disbursements made under this fund crossed the figure of Rs. 3 lacs for the first time in the history of the Sabha. The total amount disbursed was Rs. 3,09,200/-, as compared to Rs. 2,47,200/- disbursed in the immediately preceding year.

6. DESTITUTE SENIOR CITIZENS WELFARE FUND:

This Fund was launched in 2006 for the welfare of needy senior citizens of our Community. The assistance is given in terms of quarterly financial disbursement, which has disbursed at Rs. 1200/- per quarter to each beneficiary in this year. The total assistance provided under this Fund crossed the figure of Rs. 1 lacs during this financial year. A total of 21 beneficiaries were provided assistance of Rs. 1,02,000/- from this Fund during the year.

7. MEDICAL AID FUND

This Fund was launched during the Gudi Padva Sneh Milan programme of 2009. The Managing Committee has framed guidelines for scrutiny of applications and selection of beneficiaries. No applications for assistance were received to this Fund during the financial year, consequentially no aid was disbursed.

9. SPORTS ACTIVITIES

Sports activities are carried out at the Sports Club and its adjoining play ground.

The Sports Club of G.S.B. Sabha, Mumbai, has been organizing a one day Carrom tournament for the physically challenged, under the auspices of Mumbai District Carrom Association (MDCA), since 1996. As a tribute to the Ex-Trustee of the Sabha, Late Shri M. R. Pai, this tournament has been named as "M. R. Pai Memorial District Level Carrom Tournament for the Physically Challenged", since 2004.

Bank of Baroda has been kindly sponsoring this event for the las decade.

This year, the tournament was held on Sunday, January 20th, at the Sports Club premises, I. M. Pai Hall, at King's Circle. Happy Kaur Mann, Indian National hockey player, a recipient of Shiv Chatrapati Award and 1982 Best Sports Women Award, was the Chief Guest at the Prize distribution ceremony. The enthusiasm of the "differently abled" participants was mind blowing. Their excitement and enjoyment was evident by the way they participated in the game. They all were full of joy and cheer by the end of the day.

Refreshment for the entire day had been arranged. The members of the Managing Committee of the Sabha co-ordinated the full day Tournament.

(B) V. R. SHENOY MEMORIAL INTER GSB CRICKET TOURNAMENT

Our Sabha organized the V. R. Shenoy Memorial Inter GSB Cricket Tournament on Sunday, 3rd February, 2013, at its Sports Club grounds. This was the third season of this tournament organized to celebrate the life of Cricket lover, Shri V. R. Some observations on Accounts are as under:

The Sabha has received notice from BMC for additional payment due to revision of property taxes for Kreeda Mandir and Shree Nidhi office premises from 2009-2010 onwards. Total amount of additional property tax demanded for the period 2009-2010 to 2012-2013 amounts to Rs.2.32 lacs. The Sabha has lodged its protest in this regard with BMC and is also pursuing the matter to get the taxes reduced. Provision has been made in the accounts for this liability and is the reason for the increase in property expenses during the year.

2. The Sabha has spent Rs. 9.72 lacs, vis-à-vis Rs. 9.13 lacs spent last year, on the trust objects which includes disbursement of educational assistance, assistance to senior citizens, medical aid, marriage assistance, sports expenses and expenses on social functions. This represents 55.44 % of total expenditure.

In the last Annual Report, we had reported that Investments as on 31.03.2012 stood at Rs. 88.81 lacs and had expressed the hope that with the support of all donors and well-wishers, we should be crossing the Rs. 100 lacs mark of investments. We are happy to report that this landmark financial achievement for the Sabha has been reached and Sabha investments stood at Rs. 102.12 lacs as on 31.03.2013. The Sabha thanks all the sponsors, advertises, donors and well wishers who have made this possible.

- 3) Mr.D.A.Kamath


The Board of Trustees on getting consent letter of these 3 Trustees have recommended to re-appoint them as Trustees for the next 3 years.


FINANCE:
