


PROGRAMMES / CONTEST CONDUCTED BY G.S.B. SABHA IN THE QUARTER OCTOBER TO DECEMBER 2019



CAREER GUIDANCE WORKSHOP CONDUCTED ON 24TH NOVEMBER 2019

Sarvajanik Ganeshotsav Samiti, Wadala, conducted "Marg Darshan – A Career Guidance Workshop" on Sunday, 24th November, 2019, at the third floor Hall of Gokarna Parthagali Jeevotam Math, Shree Ram Mandir, Wadala. This one day complimentary program was sponsored by Shri Ganesh Shanbhag of SMS Financial Services Pvt Ltd.

ON TRAILS OF THE BOMBAY BUILDERS – A HERITAGE WALK CONDUCTED BY GSB SABHA MUMBAI ON 22ND DECEMBER 2019

"Whatever good things we build ends up building us." Jim Rohm (Motivational speaker and writer)

Day by day as we grow, the city that we live in grow around us; we shape each other, sometimes knowingly sometimes unknowingly. This has been happening for generations, every Goud Saraswath Brahmin would have heard of their forefathers migration to this city, our elders never fail to remind us of the sacrifices and the glorious past of the city. A time when the streets were less crowded and things purchased in a few annas. As the famous author John Ruskin put it

"We require from buildings two kinds of goodness: first, they doing their practical duty well: then that they be graceful and pleasing in doing it."

The questions that always intrigued local historians were, why did Bombay (now Mumbai) land up like what it is today, what prevented it from being another Chiplun or Ratnagiri?

The answer maybe right in our face but still elusive like the mythical mermaid (after all you cannot separate Mumbai from its sea).



Thus, a group of early morning inquisitive enthusiasts commenced on the tour to dwell deep into the layers, into the visual story of part of the heritage precinct, starting from the newly conserved Flora Fountain to the Bhikha Behram Parsi Well, through the heritage predict to the Wellington Fountain.

The tour started with a little quiz right at the start point, with a candy bar as an appropriate incentive to provide energy for the walk. Although each were quite familiar with the building, the stories that these stone facades revealed created an awe amongst the participants.

Hardly anyone knew of the "Maratha ditch" (nothing political here) which could have passed below the present Hutama Chowk (poetic justice in stone, as the ditch was created to keep the Marathas away from the seat of power).

All the participants appreciated the importance of heritage conservation, looking at the efforts carried out on Flora fountain and Ismailia Building (Zara store).

Architecture and culture can hardly be separated which was evident at Bhikha Behram Parsi Well, although a small



community it's the Parsis, Jews and Khojas, who contributed a lot to this precinct and there statues stand as an reminder for all future generations.

As the participants walked alone what may have been the line of the west wall of the fort, they appreciated the views and the stories of the vast Esplanade greens on one side and the Imperial buildings on the other.

The stories were narrated based on 3 P's i.e. place, purpose & people. This story telling format which included some simple lessons in Gothic and medieval architecture, customs and rituals of various communities and the urge of the administrates of the Raj to design "optima civitate" added an unique masala to the event.

No story of Bombay is complete without its maritime history, in fact it's the name of the city was the English corruption of the Portuguese word "boa baía" meaning good bay.

All the participants were awe struck, as we passed various structures and its connection with the then rich and famous, many whose richness was closely connected to the sea.

One of the purposes of such heritage tours is to create awareness of the intrinsic value of conservation of our heritage and the effects of apathy. This was visually realised when the participants saw Esplanade Mansion (formerly Watson Hotel) the oldest cast iron frame building in western part of India, and now matter of debate between the two extremes of thought leading either to its conservation and demolition.

As W H Auden the English American poet, spelled it so lucidly -"Thousands have lived without love, but not one without water"

Keeping the element of water as the start and never-ending theme, the tour concluded at the Wellington fountain.

The tour was highly appreciated by all the participants.

The tour was conducted by Subhas Rao Mallya a history enthusiast and student at university campus Kalina, with Sheela S Iyer from the Dept. of Tourism, with inputs by experts from University of Mumbai, Conservation laboratory CSVSM museum. & inputs from Dr Kurush Dalal, Dr Prachi Moghe, Dr Suraj Pandit from University of Mumbai and Dr Anand Kanitkar Deccan College Pune.

In addition to this, abortion could be possible only in respect of uninteresting works of literature by halfliterate poets. Low work was only by a weaver who had woven a lowpriced cloth. The declining friendship was between oil in the legged lamp and burning wick. Nobody in the kingdom was crooked and the name, "Durmati" was quoted only in the context of 'Samvatsara', one in the cycle of sixty years! Why speak round about? If at all one had to see immoral character, it was the bumble bee that was a drink addict sucking honey and also a debauchee, flying from one 'suragi' flower to another that too not openly but in the remote forest!

...There was peace and prosperity everywhere. So not only during the day but even at night people were not closing the doors of their houses and they were kept open with oil lamps burning and throwing light, without the fear of theft, robbery or looting!"...

A KONKANI IN A BLAZING TOWER

June 6: Thirty-six years ago, I would have been charred to death in a serious fire accident in Delhi, but 'escaped by the skin of my teeth' as the saying goes. This experience was recounted by me in an article published by a magazine called KONKAN IN DELHI edited and published by Mr. Maxwell Pereira, IPS, who later became Commissioner of Police, Delhi. Unfortunately the press cuttings and pictures of the fire which I had preserved have faded over the course of time and unfit for publishing here.

On that fateful day of 6th June 1983 when the Highrise building GOPALA TOWERS in the concrete jungle that is Rajendra Place, New Delhi, went into flames among the eighty odd unfortunate souls who were trapped atop the terrace was a Konkani. I would like to share with readers the nerve-racking experiences of those agonising 6 hours with Death breathing down my collar.

At about 11.30 a.m. we were having a meeting in our Director's room on the 8th floor (which housed IDPL Marketing Division) when a peon came running into the room saying "Saheb, the building is on fire. Please get down immediately." From the 8th floor we could see neither any fire nor smoke and we took it lightly. However, we asked our women employees to leave the office and go down to safety. We took another ten minutes to close our rooms, switch off the air conditioners and open the windows. By the time we tried to get down the stairs (elevator had been disabled as per safety requirements) we found dense clouds of smoke rising. Besides, the stairs were cluttered up with empty coca cola crates, blocking the way. People from the lower floors were rushing up to the terrace as the fire and smoke had engulfed the lower floors. We all tried to go to the terrace, but the smoke was making it difficult for us to breathe and we had to keep moistened handkerchiefs to our nose to smother the fumes and somehow reached the terrace.

It took half an hour for the first fire tenders to arrive and for the next half hour practically nothing was done either to put out the fire or rescue the trapped people. Water jet from the snorkels could not reach beyond the 6^{th} floor in this 13 storeyed building. Around this time, the news had spread all over Delhi and Rajiv Gandhi who was then the Congress Secretary and Jag Mohan the Governor of Delhi had reached the spot and were supervising the fire fighting and rescue operations.

At about 12.30 pm the firemen tried to connect our terrace with that of the adjoining building with nylon rope ladders as a bridge, but hardly 4 persons could be rescued before the ropes got burnt and the ladder had to be withdrawn. We were on tenterhooks as to when succour would come. At about 1.30 p.m. the Fire Officer (who was the only casualty in this tragic episode) came up and told us that the stairs had been cleared and we could move down. About 100 people went down through the staircase, but when our turn came, we were caught in the clouds of smoke billowing out of 9th and 10th floors making it impossible to breathe even through wet cloth. Perhaps the posh false ceilings and interior decoration material used in these floors occupied by Sriram Fibres made an ideal grist for the fire. I tried to scamper back to the terrace alive and heaved a sigh of relief.

Around this time, a couple of helicopters came hovering over us but could not land on the terrace or even come down to within ten feet for fear of their fuel tanks catching fire. One of the copters did lower a rope with a fibreglass chair tied to it and could pull out three people from the crowd who were lucky to be the first to be rescued. Needless to say, one of them was the son-in-law of the Governor who had come to Gopala towers to attend a business meeting. By now the fire was raging fiercely on the 12th and 13th floors and we felt as if we were virtually in a blast furnace. A few of the persons including a pregnant lady fainted due to the dehydration and fright. There was no water to revive them. We had to drink the hot and dirty water from the cooling tower of the air conditioning plant full of carbon particles and mud to slake out thirst. Even this water was like nectar to us.

Looking down, we could see thousands of curious onlookers, dignitaries, fire service people, but none of them could do anything to save us. The flames burst out on the terrace and the wooden frame of the cooling tower itself caught fire. We climbed on to the brick structure covering the water tank. The flames were rising still higher and almost licking our feet. We could not see in the dense dark smoke nor breathe freely. Three fire service officers who were with us told us that the end was near. I remembered my Maker and the family back home on vacation in Mangalore who were blissfully unaware of what was happening to me on the mass funeral pyre that was the terrace.

People started chanting "Jai Mata di" as God indeed was the last hope. After ten minutes of suspense and the closest of encounters with death, the flames started subsiding. Providence had indeed come to our rescue. Nevertheless, the terrace was still smouldering, and it was unsafe to climb down from the water tank. After about half an hour at about 3.30 pm the firemen put up a ladder on the rear side of the building connecting it with Pragati Towers. One by one, with a leash around our chests, holding on to the nylon ropes on both sides serving as a banister, we ventured out to cross rung by rung with 160 feet of void separating us from terra firma vertically. We dared not look down. We only looked forward to the safety of Pragati Towers. By 6 pm all of us had crossed over. We grabbed glasses of cool drinking water and nimbu pani from the hands of the social workers and volunteers who were waiting for us. Six and half hours of a harrowing experience had ended. But the memory of it will remain through our lives. As soon as I reached home, I went to the nearest temple to thank God for saving my life and talked to my wife at Mangalore, who was badly shaken by the images she saw on Doordarshan.

One thing which struck all of us through this ordeal was the utter helplessness of the firefighting squad either to contain the fire or to hasten the rescue operations. They had only one ladder which they used for evacuation purposes. The hydraulic ladder could not even reach the ninth-floor level. The helicopters could have been summoned immediately the fire broke out and people were seen rushing up to the terrace at 11.30 a.m. instead of the copters reaching at 1.30 pm when the gust of air from their rotors were only fuelling the fire further.

An interesting observation by me during this episode was the behaviour of three Japanese who were also trapped with us on the terrace. They showed tremendous equanimity. They never lost their cool, took snaps of the helicopters as they arrived and advised us how to avoid the flames. They declined to be rescued first and were among the last to "catwalk" across the rope ladder to safety. There is much we can learn from them. The Japanese as a race must have overcome the fear of death, accident and tragedies long back after Hiroshima and Nagasaki and the perennial earthquakes they experience every year.

BREAST CANCER – A SILENT MENACE IN THE SOCIETY

The term CANCER generally instils fear and panic for most people and their families. As a Cancer Surgeon, I would like to dispel any such notions about cancer and hopefully educate the readers about Cancer so that this menace can be tackled in a better way.

This article will focus on Breast Cancer. Breast Cancer is a simple yet complex form of cancer where many women ignore the signs of it due to shame or plain ignorance. If detected early, breast cancer can be easily cured and the patient can be assured of a long and good life. However, most women are detected late due to the reasons mentioned above and then have all the problems associated with the disease.

The main causes of breast cancer are usually genetic, where if another family member has the disease (such as mother or sister), the person in question is at a greater risk. Tobacco consumption and alcohol consumption have been suggested to be risk factors, but are not very strongly associated. Women who have achieved menarche early (before 12 years age), have had menopause late (after around 45 years of age), women who have had children after 30 years of age, those who have not borne children or those who have not breastfed are at greater risk for the disease. All women who fall in the above categories should be extra vigilant towards the disease.

Most cancer associations recommend that every woman above the age of 40 should get herself regularly checked for breast cancer by a proper qualified doctor who is experienced in detecting the same. Those women who have a history of breast or any other cancer in the family should get regular checkups

after the age of 18 only. An interval of 3 years between each check-up is considered a bare minimum, although most international protocols advise annual checkups after the age of 40. During the check up, the woman is also taught about breast cancer and how she can self examine herself at home.

Basic signs that all women should look for are any change in shape of the breast, any asymmetry seen, the presence of a lump or an abnormal discharge. Any of these signs should ring alarm bells and the woman should immediately go see a doctor. Remember, breast cancer can affect any woman of any age, so it is always better to be vigilant. Having regular checkups even in an apparently healthy woman is a small price to pay compared to the late detection of the disease and the associated physical, mental and financial trauma it can cause.

I sincerely hope this article reaches out not only to all the female readers but also the male readers such that they encourage all women above 40 years of age to get regular health checkups specific towards breast cancer and that the taboo towards this disease is broken. Please do write in about your doubts and experiences with regards to this disease so more people can be educated about it. I sincerely look forward to your comments. Donors specify the specific scheme which they wish to support while making corpus/endowment donations. The Sabha mentions the underlying motive of the donor in the receipt issued to the donor and also prints the details in the Annual Report for the year. The donation amount gets merged with the Endowment Fund and is carried forward as a common Fund to the next year.

Many donors have now expressed a desire that they would like to create an endowment to perpetuate the memory of a loved one and would like to add on to the endowment every year. The creation of a personalized endowment leads to a very close personal association of the donor with the endowment and fulfils his/her desire to add to the endowment every year.

Considering the above objectives, the Sabha launched the concept of personalized endowment funds to work under the banner of the main endowment funds listed above.

GUIDELINES FOR OPERATION OF PERSONALIZED ENDOWMENTS

The minimum amount to create a personalized endowment is Rs. 50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand Only). The donor/s can add to the personalized endowment year after year. The minimum amount to be added to an existing endowment is Rs. 10,000/-.

The Sabha will maintain a separate record for each personalized endowment fund and the status of the each personalized endowment fund will appear in the Annual Reports presented by the Sabha.

HARIGRAM – VILLAGE OF GOD, THE GOD OF ELDERS

Some time ago, I took a couple of family friends to visit Harigram - the Senior Citizen Retiral Home in Panvel, that was started under the guidance of H.H.Shrimat Vidyadhiraj Tirth Swamiji of Shri Gokarn Patagali Jeevottam Math in November 1998. It was not my first visit there, having been a sporadic visitor since 2012.

This visit though, lifted my spirits in a way that earlier visits had not done. The Home is currently operating at full capacity, housing 75 people in all. The good work being done there, without publicity or aggressive marketing, has obviously borne fruit, since now there is a waiting list of people waiting to occupy rooms or villas there. The villas especially, are in great demand. The Trust activities are efficiently managed by dedicated Committee and Board of Trustees, headed by Chairman, Shri Rajan Bhat.

The Home is situated in a setting reminiscent of an old Mangalorean house, with a large maider and paider (front and back garden). Through slow and steady effort over the past 4-5 years, the grounds are now home to many coconut, banana, mango, breadfruit (jeevi kadgi), jackfruit, amla, bimbool and papaya trees. Often, during pujas and get togethers, the homegrown coconuts and bananas are adequate to meet all in house demand for both cooking and puja requirements! Gardening enthusiasts amongst the residents take great pride in cultivating their own little patch of garden near their villa

There is a Ram Mandir on the premises and some of the residents are meticulous about doing the alankar (decoration) of the idol with flowers, while others use the premises to conduct bhajan sessions. Some of the more competitively inclined residents indulge in raucous, sometimes contentious, carrom board games. This time, a resident's daughter and son-in-law had come to visit her from the States. They spent 4 days as guests in the resident's villa – the daughter said she felt like she had come to her kullaar (mother's house). With typical amchigalle cuisine, made with

love and enthusiasm, and served with big smiles by the husbandwife team of Subramaniam and Sumati Hegde, the mealtime there really does feel like a homecoming

On one of my earlier visits, we met a Gujarati couple. Like true Gujaratis who value good meals, they come down once every couple of weeks, just to partake of the lunch there. While the Home is run by GSBs, people of any community are welcome to live there. There is a trial period of 1 month, after which both the residents and the new comers confirm whether the new applicants are to be accepted into the community. Depending on availability of rooms, Harigram also allows people to come and stay for a couple of days or a week at a time, just to experience the place.

Harigram has instituted a scheme of Nitya Seva. For a lump sum, one can sponsor the lunch on any specific day, for 20 years. A good way to commemorate any special day in one's life – an anniversary, a birthday. On one occasion, when we were there – one of the residents was eagerly anticipating lunch service – "today we have a special lunch". Her excitement was contagious, and we all started to look eagerly, to see what special treat we were going to be served.





We have lost a great community leader. He made a difference in the lives of so many people in the community and left a very positive impact and legacy for years to come .through the work he did his spirit will live in forever.



SPICY ACCOMPANIMENTS

We amchigeles are ingenious in making the best use of all our cooking ingredients. This can be observed from the range of dry chutney (pitti), gojjus etc. Listed below are a few of them.

Molaga Pitti

This is dry powder made from lentils and spices. When mixed with oil or ghee it makes a great accompaniment with idlies and dosas.

Ingredients

- 1 cup urad dal
- 1 cup chana dal
- 25 dry red chillies
- 1/2 cup sesame seeds
- 1 tsp asafoetida powder
- Salt to taste
- 1 tbsp oil

Method

- 1) Heat a karahi and roast the sesame seeds till they release aroma. Keep aside to cool.
- 2) In the same karahi add oil and fry the urad dal on slow heat till light brown. Keep aside.
- 3) Fry the chana dal on slow heat till light brown. Keep aside.
- 4) Fry the dry red chillies till they turn crisp (take care not to burn them).
- 5) First powder the sesame seeds and keep aside.
- 6) Powder the dry red chillies, add the dals along with asafoetida and make a coarse powder.
- 7) Mix the powdered dals along with the sesame seed powder and salt. Store in an airtight container.

Karbeva Chutney Pitti

Curry leaves are widely used in our cuisine for tempering dishes. They not only impart a great flavour to the dishes but are also packed with lots of health benefits. Surplus curry leaves can be made into chutney pitti that can be had with meals or also with rice gruel (pej).

Ingredients

- 2 cups curry leaves (karbeva)
- 1/2 cup grated coconut
- 1/2 cup chana dal
- 8-10 dry red chillies
- 1 tsp of asafoetida powder
- Marble sized ball of tamarind

Method

- 1) Dry roast the curry leaves till crisp. Keep aside to cool.
- 2) Dry roast the chana dal till light brown. Keep aside.
- 3) Roast the coconut till brown. Keep aside to cool.
- Roast the dry red chillies till crisp and when cool grind it along with curry leaves, chana dal, coconut, asafoetida, tamarind and salt to a coarse powder.
- 5) Store is an airtight jar and serve as accompaniment with meals or with pej.
- 6) The shelf life of this chutney pitti is up to a month.

Kothambari Palya Gojju

Coriander leaves are used to garnish many dishes. It can also be made into a sweet and spicy gojju to accompany your meals.

Ingredients

- 2 cups of coarsely chopped coriander leaves
- 1/2 cup grated coconut
- 3-4 green chillies
- 1/4 cup jaggery
- Marble sized ball of tamarind
- 1 tsp oil
- 1tsp mustard seeds
- Salt to taste

Method

- 1) Grind together grated coconut, green chillies, tamarind, jaggery and salt to a smooth paste with the help of little water.
- 2) Add the chopped coriander leaves and blend to a smooth paste. Transfer to a bowl and add water to get a semi thick consistency.
- 3) Heat oil in a small karahi, add mustard seeds, as they splutter pour over the coriander gojju. Mix and serve.
